

How do I Write a Tutorial?

What Document Format is Preferred for Submission?

The simplest way to submit your article is as a Microsoft Word document (DOC, DOCX) with the images included in it. But if you don't have Microsoft Word, you can alternately use any other word processing software that you may have. Just create your document and export your completed document as a Rich Text Format (RTF) or as a Text file (TXT). If submitting a Text file, the images required for this document would also need to be included in an Email.

Where and How do I Send my Tutorial?

Once you've completed the tutorial, send everything as Email attachments to libman@penturners.org . I'll work with you to polish it to your liking. I will edit your document in MS Word using our IAP formatting. Lastly, I'll create the Cover Sheet and convert the complete tutorial to a PDF file and add it to the Library, the Menu and announce the addition of it to our members.

What does the Library Manager do?

The Library Manger is responsible for developing and managing the library of reference information at the site. He/she solicits contributions from authors, helps produce and edit articles and tutorials, and completes the indexing of that content.
